Howard Lamb is a former Police Officer with the West Yorkshire Police who has been involved within the Internet industry for several years. In his current role with the Federation Against Copyright Theft, Howard is responsible for liaising with Internet Service Providers on matters relating to infringement of copyrighted audio visual material and is working with Film Education on their education and awareness campaign. He was responsible for creating one of the first Police Liaison units within the Internet sector. During his time with Energis, one of the larger ISP's operating within the UK, he became a director of the Internet Watch Foundation representing the views of the industry sector. He was also vice chair of the Internet Crime Forum. Howard has represented the Internet community at G8 conferences on High Tech Crime together with being a technical advisor to the Home Office on Data Retention. He has been involved in developing and delivering Internet awareness training to Police at a variety of levels. With the former National Hi-Tech Crime Unit Howard had responsibility for heading the Industry Liaison Team as well as representing UK Law Enforcement at Interpol. He took the lead on behalf of the G8 H-Tech Crime Group in developing a working relationship with global technology companies.
